Where participating students will serve as **AMBASSADORS** of wetland knowledge and expertise for their home countries and home institutions.



Our Mission

- To develop an international student exchange program in which graduate students will participate in a visiting research fellowship at a university outside of their home country that features rigorous wetland science research opportunities.
- This initiative is expected to not only provide top-notch educational opportunities for future wetland scientists around the globe, but also to enhance international networking, wetland science information exchange, and communication among members of the Society of Wetland Scientists.



Goals

- Provide quality research-education opportunities for students around the world who are interested in wetland science research
- Promote international, scientific collaboration between universities by encouraging exchange of students
 - Develop and provide support for student travel, housing, and living expenses for the duration of the visiting fellowship



Pilot Year

- **SUMMER 2017**
- Include up to 5 graduate students
 (enrolled in Master's or Ph.D. programs)
- Advertisement to begin September 2016
- Applications due January 2017
- Acceptance and program match information to be distributed March 2017



Partnership

- Currently looking to partner with universities, colleges, and wetlands-related research programs interested in hosting
- Visiting research fellowship to be of short duration, approximately 2 months
- Compiling list of potential host institutions to seek funding authorization from the SWS Board of Directors
